DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I discovered my love of performance when I was 5 years old. My first performative memory is at my grandma's house in Manassas, VA, when she bought me a microphone for my birthday. If you grew up in the 90's, you might remember the bright pink mics attached to a stereo that you'd have to carry around with you. Of course, I had to try out my new toy immediately, and a few days later when my great-grandpa visited, I put on an entire show of self-written dialogue and songs (and a few fan favorites such as "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star") for my family. This was my first play. When I was 6, I became obsessed with biology and geology, so I asked my grandpa to film a short clip of the scientific discoveries I made with my first microscope. This was my first movie, Bill Nye style. In first grade, I created a game called, "G.I. Joe versus Barbies," that everyone in my class played all year. The girls would defend the dome jungle gym against the infiltrating G.I. Joe boys, and day to day we'd keep track of their advancements on a map that our teacher let us post to the classroom wall. This was my first devised performance.

When we're little, everything we experience is a new and magical discovery. We take in the world through playing pretend, and kids can have fun with the simplest of objects. The jungle gym can be a maze-like fortress; your headband can be a princess crown; gather enough rocks, twigs, and leaves, and they can be the stew you cook while you pretend to be a pioneer in the American west. As we get older, our world gets smaller. Because we gain more knowledge and learn to understand that the jungle gym is for kids to climb on, the headband is to keep your hair back, and the rocks, twigs, and leaves are just pieces of nature on the ground, we find that our brains force us to move beyond imagination and process the world around us literally. Everything must make sense, everything must have a purpose, and if we can't see it...we don't believe in it.

The magic of theatre is that it invites us to revitalize our imaginations. To see the world, not as it is, but as the play sees it. In the theatre, boxes can be turned into beds, pool noodles can be made into children's toys, and windows can become portals to a magical, alternate reality.

J.M. Barrie first wrote "Peter and Wendy" as a play in 1904 and later as a novel in 1911. Most of us might be more familiar with other adaptations such as Disney's animated "Peter Pan" (1953) or "Hook" featuring Robin Williams (1991) which acts as a sequel of sorts to Barrie's original work. The subtitle for "Peter and Wendy" is, "The Boy Who Wouldn't Grow Up," which serves to introduce the play's primary theme: the conflict between childhood and the responsibilities we're expected to take on as adults. When I wrote the adaptation that you'll see today for Mill Mountain Theatre, I had a strong desire to maintain as much of the original structure of the 1904 play as possible. This adaptation is divided into 5 acts with the same scene titles used in Barrie's Peter and Wendy. In writing this play, I found that I was tremendously inspired by my own recollections of childhood and those of my students, many of whom are in our cast, that I am fortunate enough to witness and play my own part in on a daily basis.

Our adaptation emphasizes the joy of discovery, the conflict between wanting to stay young forever and wanting to grow up, and the uncertainties of our inevitable death. In this world, Peter Pan is reimagined as a well known figure to the Darling children through stories and toys—akin to a modern day superhero. Wendy Darling, the play's protagonist, loves to play pretend with her brothers, but both her and her parents realize that the days when Wendy wants to "play at Peter Pan" will soon be behind them. Wendy discovers that she's conflicted—does she want to grow up or does she want to stay forever young? You've all heard the sayings—time only moves forward, all good things must come to an end, nothing can last forever. As you're reading this director's note, I'd like for you to take a moment to remember the happiest day of your life. Now imagine if that day never ended. This might be fun, at first, but now I'd like for you to consider all the things you'd be missing if you were never able to move beyond that singular moment in time. To live is to experience both joy and misery, and one cannot exist without the other. Whether we want to or not, one day our lives will come to an end, and to die would be an awfully big adventure.

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The Mill Mountain Theatre Student Advisory Board is made up of MMT Conservatory students who have been nominated and elected by their peers and the MMT Education staff to serve on this board. Their primary purpose is to provide feedback to the theatre from the student perspective on the existing structures and programs, as well as to generate ideas for future programming, performance titles, and ways to support the theatre and the Roanoke Arts Community. The SAB will also nominate and elect officers to serve each semester, and the elected president will serve as the representative to the MMT Board of Directors at select monthly meetings to observe the proceedings and provide student input.
